

# FLINT RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION EVANGELISM EVENT TRAILER (F.E.E.T.)

*Faithful Stewards of God's Vision through God's Provision for His glory!*  
(Interpretation: God gave this to us, so don't mess it up!)

## FEES

1. \$200.00 Rental for 1-3 days
2. \$300.00 Rental for 4-7 days (off season only)
3. \$100.00 Refundable damage/cleaning deposit
4. \$ 25.00 Late fee per day

## POLICIES

- Churches leasing the evangelism unit must provide a certificate of insurance from their insurance carrier naming the Flint River Baptist Association as an additional insured. The policy must provide a minimum of \$1,000,000 in liability coverage. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- Pick-up and return must be during regular Flint River Baptist Association office hours.
- Trailer will be released to and towed only by a licensed driver of at least 21 years of age who has knowledge and experience with pulling and backing a trailer unit of minimally 6 feet by 12 feet.
- The towing vehicle must be equipped with adequate connections to insure that trailer tail lights and turn signals function properly.
- Use of F.E.E.T. unit is limited to FRBA member churches, church plants, or missions. (Liability issues necessitate that a church plant/mission secure unit use under the auspices of its sponsoring church.)
- Use of the trailer will be restricted to the counties encompassed by the Flint River Baptist Association.
- Rental is limited to a maximum of three days during peak seasons. Dates for peak seasons will be established by the FRBA and are subject to change from year to year.
- Rental will be for the entire unit only. Equipment may not be rented on a piecemeal basis.
- Unit must be reloaded according to inside graphics for proper weight distribution.
- Repeated violations of these policies may result in denial of use.

### ***PLEASE MAKE NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING IMPORTANT INFORMATION:***

- ▶ ***ALWAYS CHOCK ALL FOUR WHEELS WHEN TRAILER IS PARKED.***
- ▶ ***GASOLINE MAY BE LEFT IN THE GENERATOR ONLY IF A FUEL STABILIZER HAS BEEN ADDED TO THE TANK. OTHERWISE ALL GASOLINE MUST BE BURNED OUT OF THE UNIT.***

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. Loading process should begin by deflating blow-ups and allowing generator to burn unused gasoline (if necessary).
2. Leadership should be informed of location of included fire extinguisher and first aid kit.
3. Sound system may be damaged by temperature fluctuations and should be stored in the church building when the trailer is not in use.
4. Trailer roof vent should be left open during summer use.
5. Renting church is responsible for liability and medical insurance coverage from the time the trailer is picked up until it is returned. (See first bullet under Policies on Page 1). In addition, the insurance carrier for the towing vehicle will also carry some liability until the trailer is parked and unhitched.
6. Trailer is equipped with a 2-inch trailer ball and a four-prong pigtail.

## CHECKLIST FOR RETURN

- All gasoline has been completely burned out of generator before loading (if necessary) and no gasoline in other containers is inside the trailer.
- All food equipment has been thoroughly cleaned.
- All bins are loaded according to bin labels.
- All pieces of table games and carnival games are accounted for and properly secured.
- Tables and chairs were wiped down before loading. (Cleaning products provided)
- Tents have been cleared of debris and returned to storage cases with all individual pieces.
- Sound system equipment has been returned to storage cases according to checklist included with the system.
- All equipment has been loaded according to inside trailer graphics. (This is extremely important for correct weight distribution.)
- Inside of trailer has been swept clean. (Broom and dustpan provided)
- All equipment has been properly secured for transport.

**NOTE:** Churches receiving the F.E.E.T. unit from a group other than FRBA should go over the check list with that organization VERY CAREFULLY to ensure that all equipment is present and working properly. Once you take delivery of the unit, you are responsible for returning it to the Association clean, with all equipment in place, and everything in working order.

# FLINT RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION INFLATABLE OPERATING RULES AND PROCEDURES

**OPERATORS WILL READ AND UNDERSTAND THESE RULES, AS WELL AS THE INSTRUCTION PLATE PROVIDED ON THE UNIT. ALL OPERATORS AGREE TO ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:**

1. A responsible adult must supervise and be positioned at the entrance of the ride to observe and assist riders at all times during operation.
2. Blower units must be inaccessible to children and should be in a position that can be observed by the operator.
3. Riders will be sorted by size. Only riders of the same size will be allowed in the ride together. (Children under three years old are not allowed. They should play in the small Bounce House.) Weight limits and number of riders as listed below shall not be exceeded. Limits are:

Children 3 to 5 Yrs Old	Children 6 to 8 Yrs Old	Children 9 to 12 Yrs Old	Teens 13 to 16 Yrs Old	Total Maximum Weight Load
10	8	6	4	800

4. All riders must remove their shoes and any sharp objects before entering the inflatable. Sharp objects include, but are not limited to, eyeglasses, toys, jewelry, keys, or any other item that could injure another rider or the damage unit.
5. Food, drink, gum, and/or pets are prohibited in the inflatable unit at all times.  
**NOTE: ABSOLUTELY NO SILLY STRING OR SPRAY STRING OF ANY TYPE IS TO BE USED NEAR THE INFLATABLE. IT CAN SEVERELY DAMAGE THE VINYL.**
5. The following behaviors are not to be tolerated by unit operator: Roughhousing, horseplay, somersaults, diving, wrestling, flips, or climbing on the nets. Anyone who does not obey these rules after being warned by the operator must be required to exit the ride.
7. Riders must exit the inflatable unit by sliding in a sitting position, feet first.

## **SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS**

**Riders are to be IMMEDIATELY evacuated in the following conditions:**

- ▶ Sustained winds of more than 15 miles per hour.
- ▶ Inclement weather conditions including rain, thunder, lightening, or tornado activity.
- ▶ Accumulation of water within the unit (inflatable must be dried with a towel prior to re-entry of riders.
- ▶ Sudden, unexpected deflation of the unit.

**Important Trouble-shooting Information regarding unexpected deflation:**

- 1) If motor has stopped, check power cord connections.
- 2) Be sure that outlet has no other appliances plugged into it and ensure that breaker for the outlet is on.
- 3) If motor is continuing to run, check for blockage of air-intake screen on side of motor.
- 4) Check both tubes on back of inflatable unit for snugness and tighten ties if necessary.
- 5) If problem persists, try another power outlet.
